- 1) Admission throughout the year for children with disabilities
- 2) No rejection policy in admission
- 3) Enrollment drive for out of school children.
- 4) Admission in age appropriate class and relaxation in upper age at entry level classes.
- 5) Services of Special Education Teacher
- 6) Services of Attendant/Helper to children with severe disabilities
- 7) Specialized Teaching Learning Materials
- Financial Assistance to children with disabilities including Escort allowance, Transportation allowance, Reader allowance, Therapeutic Allowance, Top-up scholarship, & Girls stipend.
- Weekly meeting of parents of children with disabilities and Special Education Teachers
- 10) Development and implementation of Individualized Education Plans (IEP) for Children with disabilities.
- 11) IEP review meetings with different subject teachers, EVGCs, class teachers, parents etc.
- 12) Annual medical assessment camp for identification and assessment of children with disabilities
- 13) Distribution of free aids and appliances to children with disabilities
- 14) Counseling of parents of children with disabilities
- 15) Free Braille books to Children with Blindness
- 16) Scribe facility to children with blindness
- 17) Financial Assistance for large print books to children with low vision
- 18) Orientation of principal, Educational administrators, parents/guardians etc,
- 19) Exposure visits of Children with Disabilities and their peers.
- 20) Free textbooks and uniform
- 21) Barrier free and accessible environment
- 22) Annual identification and assessment camp for children with Intellectual Disability and Specific Learning Disability.
- 23) Orientation/Training of teachers on Inclusive Education through SCERT.
- 24) Resource room/centre in each school and district.
- 25) Different subject options for Children with disabilities studying in class IX & X
- 26) Different exemptions and concessions provided by CBSE to Children with Disabilities studying in Class X are extended to children with disabilities studying in lower classes also.
