### **2.Proposal for Special Training of OoSC 2020-21**

At present, 826 STCs are being run in Delhi in the schools of DOE & MCD, NDMC & DCB where 31637 OoSC are enrolled.

#### **Objective:**

The Objective is to provide Special training to Out of School Children.

#### **Proposed activity:**

It is proposed to provide Special training to identified Out of School Children in Special Training Centres set up for this purpose so as to ensure their seamless transition into age appropriate class after completion of bridge course.

**Strategy:**

The Special Training for Out of School Children is being conducted in the schools of DoE, MCDs, NDMC & DCB. In the year 2020-21 as well, the Special Training Centers will be operational for the enrolment of Out of School Children so as to prepare them through a bridge course for induction in age appropriate class.

4435 children studying in STCs will continue for the year 2020-21 to bring them to the age appropriate level. During the survey conducted in Winter Vacations, 9443 OoSC were identified in which 341 children are to be directly admitted and 1710 children are to be enrolled in STCs. The admission process of remaining 7392 OoSC is also underway.

It is expected that OoSC in the age group of 6 to 14 years of age will be admitted in age appropriate class in 2020-21.

**Justification/Rationale:**

The Right to Education Act, 2009 provides for free and compulsory education to all children in the age group of 6 to 14 years. It is to fulfil this aim that the Out of School Children are identified through targeted surveys and enrolled in Special Training Centres set up for this purpose.

### **3. Technical Support Group (TSG) 2020-21**

**1. Progress against the approved targets during year 2019-20**

- State has identified 44, 932 out of school children (OOSC) in 2019-20 and it has committed that all the identified out of school children will be enrolled in schools during 2019-20. PAB has approved Rs. **2254.74** Lakhs for provision of Special Training to OOSC.
- State is reporting that it has covered 31,848 lakh children which is is 70.9% of the target. Financial achievement against PAB approval is 57.62%.

**1.1 Process of Mainstreaming of children after completion of Special Training.**

**a) Process of mainstreaming of children in age appropriate class.**

Regular assessment is done by CRCC/HoS/STC teacher to assess the progress of the child. If the child achieves either A, B or C grade, then the child is ready to be mainstreamed in the age appropriate class.

**b) Support provided to children once they are mainstreamed into age appropriate classes after their Special Training is completed.**

Regular follow-up by the STC teachers and CRCCs alongwith special attention by the regular teachers for the period of atleast 06 months.

c) **Steps taken to ensure continuation of mainstreamed children in regular schools.**

There are two strategies for ensuring continuation of mainstreamed children which include

- a. Regular follow-up by the STC teachers and CRCCs along with special attention by the regular teachers for the period of atleast 06 months and b. Module “Child Progression Chart” created for tracking each child’s educational journey.

d) **Monitoring Mechanism for (i) Special Training and (ii) after Children are mainstreamed in schools.**

- Regular monitoring is done by CRCC/HoS to assess the progress of the child studying in STC
- Regular follow-up by the STC teachers and CRCCs alongwith special attention by the regular teachers
- Module “Child Progression Chart” created for tracking each child’s educational journey.
- STC module developed for monitoring the attendance and assessment of OoSC in an STC.

**2. Status of Out of School Children identified in 2020-21**

State is reporting to have a total population of 2140467 Children in the age group of 6-14 years. It has identified **26, 264** out of school children in the same age group. The number of out of school children is 1.2% of total population. Disaggregated data is given below:

State has identified **944 CWSN** among the out of school children reported in the above table.

### 3.1 Details of survey/ updation excise.

Samagra Shiksha in the year 2020-21 proposes to take up the issue of OoSC in a very organised manner.

The main mandate of Samagra Shiksha is to plan a strategy for identification, enrolment and mainstreaming of OoSC after they have undergone Special Training for a period ranging from 3 months to 2 years, as the need may be.

Delhi being the capital of India, is like a land of dreams for a large number of people staying in the neighbouring states of Haryana, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh, therefore large number of migrant population is residing in Delhi. This population includes a sizeable number of children who are out on the streets and fall into the category of urban deprived children. Also, there are children who are from troubled homes, broken families, engaged as child labour and even some who are in conflict with law.

Samagra Shiksha Delhi has engaged the CRCC's in the task of community mobilization. Identification of OoSC in an effective and efficient manner is possible with the cooperation of SMC members, RWA members, Aanganwadi workers & outreach workers of District Child Protection Units Department of WCD. The data of identified out of school children is recorded at the Cluster level, District level and compiled data is submitted at the State level. In the month of December 2019, the Heads of Schools oriented the SMC about the salient features of RTE Act, 2009, specially w.r.t the role of STCs in bringing OoSC into mainstream education. Thereafter, winter vacation survey was conducted from 28.12.2019 to 15.01.2020 to identify Out of school Children in the catchment area of schools. The survey was conducted by STC teachers, SMC members & CRCCs. Several meetings of State Level officials held monthly meeting with DURCCs & also conducted meeting district wise CRCCs to orient them in various interventions under Samagra Shiksha.

CRCC's posted in each cluster have organised meetings with SMC members, RWA members, Anganwadi workers to sensitize them and to seek their help in the catchment area of schools, J.J clusters and such pockets having high density of population. In the light of the above mentioned facts, Samagra Shiksha Delhi proposes a target of 25500 OoSC, which includes 7392 OoSC identified during Winter Survey. In addition 4435 continued children are getting Special Training in the STCs and will be mainstreamed during the session 2020-21.

a) **Detail of Surveys conducted by the State for identification of OOSC as shown in the above table.**

The following surveys were conducted for identification of OoSC

**1) Winter Survey: - 28.12.2019 to 15.01.2020**

9443 OoSC were identified with the help of CRCCs and STC Teachers in which 341 children are to be directly admitted and 1710 children are to be enrolled in STCs. The admission process of 7392 children is also underway.

**2) Summer Survey:-15.5.2019 to 30.6.2019**

CRCC's have organised meetings with SMC members, RWA members, Anganwadi workers to sensitize them and to seek their help in the catchment area of schools, J.J clusters and such pockets having high density of population. In the light of the above mentioned facts, 4537 children were directly admitted in the school and 9622 children were admitted in Special Training Centres.

**3) Admission/Survey of "Children in Street Situation": (May – June 2019)**

Save the Children-NGO has identified 29091 OoSC in the age group of 6-14 yrs. and the list has been obtained from DCPCR. Efforts were made to locate these children and get them enrolled in school or at Special Training Centres. In this regard a circular was issued on 25.4.2019 to share the details of the children to the District Project Officers of that area to make a District Wise Co-ordination Team with the Outreach Workers of Save the Children Foundation to help in locating and to facilitate the admission of the children in nearby schools by 31.5.2019 with the coordination of CRCCs and Teachers of Special Training Centres.

Out of 29091 children, only 241 children were located with the help of outreach workers and out of 241 children 120 children were admitted in the Special Training Centres and rest 121 children were either below age/Over age and admitted to Schools. 28971 Children were not located by the Outreach Workers.

**4) Monthly survey of Rain Baseras (Night Shelters)/Admission Drive for the children residing in Rain Basera:-**

As per circular issued on 19.4.2019, Regular Surveys were conducted with the help of CRCCs, STC Teachers and SMC members in 47 Rain Baseras of (DSUIB) where the children residing in the age group of 6 to 14 years. 164 children were admitted in the nearby Schools/ STCs.

- b) Village Education Register or Ward Education Register (VER/WER) is maintained in all schools.
- c) Is Child Tracking System available and functional in the State?

**Module developed, will be operational once schools reopen**

- d) What activities have been undertaken to identified children belonging to disadvantaged and marginalised groups such as Children of Nomadic Families, Child labour, Children of Manual Scavengers and Children without adult Protection etc.
  - a. Samagra Shiksha Delhi finalized an SOP for enrolment of rescued child labour belonging to Delhi, as a result of which all DURCCs are now members of District Task Force of Labour Department
  - b. Moreover, Three Residential Hostels, two for girls and one for boys, are also being run for destitute children, homeless, orphans etc.
  - c. Convergence with Department of Women and Child Development, Delhi for sharing data of identified Out of School Children with DURCCs for enrolment in STCs

**3.2 Identification and Converge of Urban Deprived Children N.A.**

- a) No specific strategy employed by the state for identification of Urban Deprived children.
- b) No measures taken for identification and coverage of children without shelter/ adult protection.

**3.3 Identification of Child Labour:** - A list of 53 rescued child labour belonging to Delhi was shared by the Labour Department. The Labour Department shares the list of rescued child labour in the District Task Force meeting.

**3.5** What are the incentives provided to the students of the SC/ST, Minority and Marginalised Sections of the society to arrest the high level of dropout rates among them?

Opening of Aadhar linked bank account of the children from SC/ST/Minority and marginalized community is facilitated by the Heads of Schools to ensure that they are beneficiaries of Direct Beneficiary Transfer(DBT) of all the Central and State schemes.
