### **CORRIGENDUM**

This is in continuation to the circular no F(DE)29.2185-99 dated 24.09.2021 vide which the guidelines were issued to conduct the Spell Bee Competition under Samagra Shiksha in the year 2021-22.

The competition has to be conducted at School Level for Primary (IV-V) as well.

The modalities for the competition at Primary level (IV-V) may be read as follows:

#### **Screening Round at School Level for Primary (IV-V)**

25 words will be given to all the participants.

- i. After pronunciation of word, students will be given 01 minute to write.
- ii. The words will be repeated only once.
- iii. After the dictation of words, papers will be checked for finalizing top five participants for the next round.
- iv. Top three scorers will be selected for the Cluster level.

#### **Rounds at Cluster and District level for Primary (IV-V)**

- i. One Score Keeper, One Spell Master and One Observer (Independent) will conduct the competition.
- ii. The Stipulated time to spell each word is 01 minute.
- iii. After the first 30 sec, a buzzer will indicate that the last 30 sec remain, and the word must be spelt.
- iv. The speller may ask the pronouncer to say the word again, define it, or use it in a sentence within the first 30 sec. The Observer may disqualify any speller who ignores the request to start spelling after the first 30 sec at the sound of the buzzer.




- v. The speller will be awarded points if he/ she starts spelling the word within the given time but crosses the 01 minute mark.
- vi. Top three scorers will be selected for the district level.
- vii. The same rounds will be followed for selection at the district level and thus one student will be selected for State level from each district.


Further it is to mention that the list of schools, outcome, feed backs shall remain the same as given in the circular dated 24.09.2021.
