Note:

 A few periods have been allocated to *AEA i.e. Additional Enrichment Activities. Integrating an additional period for enrichment activities focused on values-based learning and holistic development, supports the objective of nurturing well-rounded individuals. Facilitators should use this dedicated time allowing children to explore critical thinking, ethical understanding and life skills beyond academic content fostering emotional intelligence and civic responsibility. Such activities complement the academic curriculum by creating space for reflection, dialogue and personal development which are essential for preparing responsible, aware and capable citizens of developed India.

- In PE periods, classrooms games such as Chess, Carrom, Scribble may also be used.
- On Saturdays, activity-based teaching should be encouraged to promote experiential learning and student engagement. Such an approach fosters creativity, collaboration and practical understanding of concepts aligning with the holistic and learner-centred vision of the National Education Policy 2020.
- One period for each class may be designated for ICT-enabled learning.
- While preparing the timetable for classes III to V, provision for block periods should be incorporated, as outlined in the model timetable, to ensure that students are not required to carry textbooks for more than three subjects on any given day.

The Heads of all Sarvodaya Vidyalayas are hereby directed to implement the same with immediate effect and apprise the same with all Assistant Teachers.
