CIRCULAR

Subject: Acceleration of APAAR ID Generation in all Schools.

The Central Institute of Educational Technology (CIET), National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), vide Letter No. **APAAR/26/07/52 dated 22.07.2026**, has requested all States/UTs to expedite the generation of **APAAR IDs** for all students to achieve early saturation under the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020.

All District DPOs, Heads of Government/Government Aided Schools and concerned officers are hereby directed to accord **top priority** to APAAR ID generation and ensure the following:

1. Conduct Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) to create awareness among parents regarding APAAR and obtain consent from parents of students whose APAAR IDs are pending.
2. Monitor APAAR ID generation at the District and School levels on a regular basis and resolve implementation issues without delay.
3. Prepare school-wise action plans with clear timelines to achieve 100% APAAR saturation.
4. Give priority to students possessing Aadhaar but who's APAAR IDs have not yet been generated.
5. Organize Aadhaar enrolment/update camps in coordination with the concerned authorities for students who do not possess Aadhaar or whose Aadhaar details require correction.
6. Ensure completion of all pending UDISE+ progression activities and resume APAAR ID generation immediately thereafter.
7. Maintain close coordination with all stakeholders to ensure timely completion of the exercise.

All Heads of Schools shall personally monitor the progress and ensure that no eligible student is left out.

District authorities shall review the progress regularly and submit action taken report weekly till achievement of 100% saturation.

Extend necessary support to schools for resolving operational issues.

The matter may be treated as **MOST URGENT**, and all concerned shall ensure expeditious completion of APAAR ID generation.

This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority.

Subject: Acceleration of APAAR ID Generation.

Dear Sir/Madam,

The Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry (APAAR) is a flagship initiative under the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020, aimed at establishing a unified digital identity for every student. APAAR facilitates seamless integration of academic records across educational systems, enables efficient student tracking, and supports evidence-based decision-making through platforms such as the Vidya Samiksha Kendra (VSK).

As of 21st July, 2026, more than 16.63 crore APAAR IDs have been successfully generated and verified through the UDISE+ platform, reflecting significant progress in the nationwide implementation of the initiative.

With schools in the NCT of Delhi having reopened for the current academic session, it is imperative to accelerate the generation of APAAR IDs in all schools to achieve early saturation. In this regard, you are requested to ensure that the following actions are undertaken on priority kindly:

1. Organise structured Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) to create awareness among parents regarding the objectives and benefits of APAAR and obtain the necessary consent for students whose APAAR IDs are yet to be generated.
2. Establish a robust monitoring mechanism at the State, District, and Block levels to regularly review progress and address implementation bottlenecks.
3. Prepare and implement district-wise and school-wise APAAR saturation plans with clearly defined targets and timelines.
4. Prioritise the generation of APAAR IDs for students who already possess Aadhaar but whose APAAR IDs have not yet been created.
5. Organise Aadhaar enrolment and update camps for students who do not possess Aadhaar and for cases requiring correction of Aadhaar-related data mismatches.
6. Strengthen participation of private schools through active engagement with school managements and effective coordination at the district level.
7. Ensure completion of all UDISE+ progression-related formalities and resume APAAR ID generation immediately upon completion of the progression process.

A list of school-level progress is enclosed for your kind information and necessary action. You are requested to accord the highest priority to the above activities and closely monitor the progress to ensure timely achievement of APAAR saturation across all schools in your UT.

Your personal intervention and continued guidance in expediting the implementation of this important national initiative will be highly appreciated.
